#### **Diocese issues warning on Boise Church**

An organization entitled "Saint Joseph's Reformed Catholic Mission Church" has recently established itself in Boise. According to its website, services are conducted out of the First United Church of Christ at 2201 Woodlawn Ave. This reformed Catholic Mission church acknowledges that it is not a "Roman" church, but part of what it identifies as the Independent Catholic movement. Please be aware that "Saint Joseph's Reformed Catholic Church" has no connection with the Diocese of Boise. Any sacraments conducted by this entity, under the title of Catholic are considered invalid.

#### **St. Mark's Kitchen**



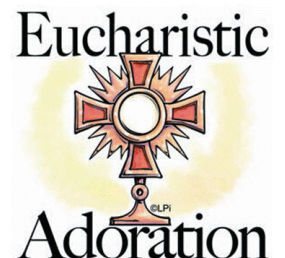
The kitchen is almost complete. Many thanks to those who stopped by the Kitchen Shower & Showing this past weekend! Your positive responses to the design and workmanship were

### HAVE YOU NOTICED?????????

WE have TWO SETS of songbooks in the pews now.....the current Breaking Bread books, dated 2011 on the front cover, have been removed from their vinyl binders and are loose in the book-holders. This is because we have already placed the 2012 edition for the coming liturgical year inside the vinyl covers.

WHY?????? We actually need to use BOTH books from now until the beginning of Advent. The NEW BOOKS are the only ones which contain all the new music we are beginning to use due to the Roman Missal changes. But the OLDER books are still needed for the current order of Mass, psalms and responses

So that we might help all of you to participate at Mass more fully, as well as to save costs for additional printing, we decided to put out all our new books earlier than usual, but still need to keep the old ones available.

We hope to help alleviate confusion with this explanation and will do our best to guide you each week until all old books can be eliminated.

WATCH THE READER BOARDS.....

the TOP SPACE will read Resp Pg and a number.....this will be for the weekly psalm response and will be found in the old books.

the 2nd space will have a number for the music for preparation of gifts, and it will come from the old books.

the 3rd space will read NB Holy and a number.....this will be for the Holy Holy Holy to be found in the NEW BOOK (in vinyl covers)

the 4th space will read NB Mem Acc and a number.....this will be for "Save Us, Savior" to be found in the NEW BOOK

the 5th space will have a number for Communion music, and it will come from the old books.

In addition, the cantor at each Mass will hold up for you to see the correct book to use at a given time. An announcement will be made at appropriate times when it can be done in a manner not interruptive to the flow of the Mass.

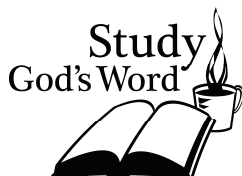
